
RC1 HOW TO CARE FOR OTHERS

Matching


Read the tips (0-4) on how to care for others and match them with one of the pictures (A-F). There is one more picture than you need. There is an example at the beginning (0).

0	Parents usually work very hard. Show them how thankful you are for what they do for the family. Surprise them with a yummy Sunday breakfast. Bring your mom flowers. Or, write a nice letter to your dad. And they would be very happy to have coffee served in bed.
1	Be friendly with your neighbours. Wave hello when you see them in the street, or stop and talk with them when you're out walking. You could even spend some time working with them in their garden. It's also very nice to ask them over for cake and coffee.
2	It's important to help out at home. Look for ways to take care of your younger brothers and sisters, like reading to them or taking them to the playground. Ask your parents if they would like help cleaning the kitchen, taking out the rubbish, or walking the dog.

Smokey Bear

In 1950, a campfire burned out of control in the Capitan Mountains of New Mexico in the United States (US). Soon there was a large wildfire and trees and bushes were in flames. A tiny bear that lived in the forest quickly climbed a tree to save his own life.

About 30 firefighters were also trapped by the firestorm and they only survived by lying face down for over an hour as the fire burned past them. Unlike the firefighters, the small bear was injured. When the men rescued the cub from the tree, they found the bear's paws and legs had been heavily burned.



Ranger Ray decided to save the animal, took him home and helped to fly the little animal to an animal doctor in Santa Fe. Ray's daughter named the bear Smokey Bear.

Soon, the story of Smokey Bear became famous all over the US and the baby bear was on his way to the zoo in Washington, DC. He received numerous gifts of honey and so many letters that he had to have his own zip code - 20252.

After his death in 1976, Smokey was returned and buried in the Smokey Bear Historical Park in the Capitan Mountains. He continues to be the symbol for wildfire prevention even today.

Happiness Education

When kids come home and tell their parents that school was "boring", the parents often understand. Adults can usually remember when they were in school and it wasn't always fun for them either.

But learning can be helpful and fun, especially with more interesting subjects. A high school in California teaches "robotics", another one in Florida offers "oceanography", in which students discover the underwater world. German schools have added options like "becoming an adult." In this course, teachers help students to understand their feelings and make better choices. In Australia, some schools offer "outdoor education" which teaches kids how to be safe around plants and animals.

Schools are deciding that it is important for children to read and do math, but children should also be kind to others and know how to take care of themselves.

In 2007, Ernst Fritz-Schubert taught the first course in "happiness education". It is now offered in 43 German schools. Children learn about values and how to achieve goals. Students answer important questions like: Who am I? What do I want? What do I need? A student who has a strong sense of self can then learn to work on a team with others.

In schools today, students can learn about the ocean, or how to be safe in nature. They can also learn about growing up or even how to be happy in life. These kinds of subjects are just as important as math or biology, and are definitely more interesting and fun.
